Wyatt Earp's: There's a new restaurant in town

Eatery and entertainment complex opens in Ramsey

Rick Luzaich and his wife, Jennifer, believe there's not enough fun in the world. Starting this month, they aim to change that.

This week, the couple opens Wyatt Earp's, a new eatery and sports complex in Ramsey, located in the former Diamonds Sports Bar and Grill.

But everything about the family-friendly venue is new, from the custom-made booths to the carpeting, to the Old West theme that conjures up the spirit of the fun-loving Earp himself. Even

the walls have undergone a makeover in the complete remodel. A hand-painted, life-size mural of Tombstone, Ariz., and the famous gunslinger and his brothers, Virgil, Morgan, and Doc Holiday, stares out over the restaurant's fun-loving patrons.

"I've always loved the mystique and the romance of the Old West," Rick said.

But this is no ordinary full-service restaurant by any means. Rick and Jennifer, in their quest to raise the Northland's fun quotient, are taking a creative approach to redefining the meaning of entertainment.

"There's a new sheriff in town!" is their motto. And there's a new restaurant in town as well.

Wyatt Earp's, named after one of Rick's favorite legendary characters, who was a peace officer, saloon-keeper, and gambler, promises something for everyone. Mouth-watering comfort food. Live music on weekends. A circular, full-service bar. A sports complex. Charitable gambling, and a whole lot more.

And where can you hitch a ride nowadays on a mechanical bull? Right down the street at Wyatt Earp's. That's where.

On the roster of other planned adult activities are: A comedy night, featuring local comedians, like Scott Hansen; Texas Hold 'Em tournaments, held twice weekly with cash prizes and gift certificates; and for singers wishing to hone their vocal chops, karaoke competitions.

Wyatt Earp's will feature a Battle of the Bands, with the top prize being a contract to play at the saloon. The winner will be determined by audience vote.

Thursday nights are Ladies' Night, and for sports enthusiasts, a theater-size screen will feature sporting events — Minnesota Vikings games, NASCAR races and boxing matches, for instance.

Don't want to sit around and gab with friends? Then a chance to play softball in one of the finest fenced-in fields in the area, volleyball or darts might be more to your liking.

And there's something for the kids, too. A full arcade of video games will keep them entertained indoors. A special playground is outdoors.

But Rick and Jennifer's fun plans don't stop here. This spirited couple in their forage for fun have come up with some special events. Like an exciting Fourth of July celebration with plans to bring in a carnival, pending city approval.

They also look forward to presenting outdoor concerts on those warm, romantic summer nights.

The official grand opening for Wyatt Earp's is planned for some time in July.
